## June 19<sup>th</sup> – June 23<sup>rd</sup>

### **Morning: Felted Birds (ages 8 and up)**

Felted Birds...Create your own bird species. Design the shape and pose of your bird on paper, and then create it. The core is foam rubber, with fluffy layers of wool wrapped around it. After wetting down with soap and water and agitating, the wool will shrink to form around your bird. You can create a kooky bird with polka dots, for example, or a serious one with lots of feathers. ### **Morning: Basket Weaving (ages 8 and up)**

Over One, Under One, Come Weave a Basket!  
You have probably woven a flat, paper mat using construction paper, but have you ever woven a basket? Using both round and flat reed, this one-week workshop will introduce students to the basics of weaving a basket. Weaving three different baskets (round bowl, berry basket, and trinket basket), students will learn to lay out a base, upset and weave the sides, and then add rims and handles. Students will also be able to add color and pattern using a variety of dyed reed. Material fee \$30.00 – Paid to Instructor.

Participate in an engaging “workshop” where multiple project demonstrations will be given every day and students can focus on what inspires them or combine techniques from the exercises. Focus will be on the “intuitive” method, which emphasizes color, pattern, and personal motif, and exploits serendipity and surprise. This is a playful approach that ensures artistic success by virtue of there being no “wrong” or “right” way. Paintings are created through accidental marks that allow forms to emerge, drawings evolve by observing random lines and shapes in the world around us, and poems come to life through collections of seemingly unrelated words.
